I hope you all having a wonderful weekend.

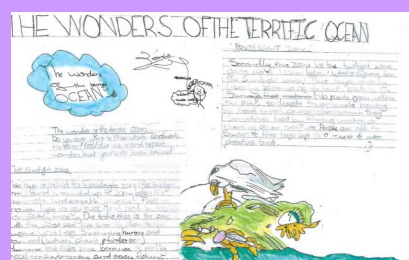

Last week the children in Year 6 Red Oak class participated in an engaging science workshop which involved making a parachute with a precious cargo attached. The children needed to work collaboratively in teams to create a package for the cargo as this held an egg. All of the teams were excited to make the parachute and to create padding inside a cup, where the egg was placed. There was a lot of discussion and teamwork and the children could not wait to test their parachutes, by dropping them from a height and discovering whether or not the egg was still intact. It was so impressive to see the children working together to create fantastic parachutes. Many of the eggs did not break and this was because the children worked so hard on their designs and thought carefully about the materials they used.
